



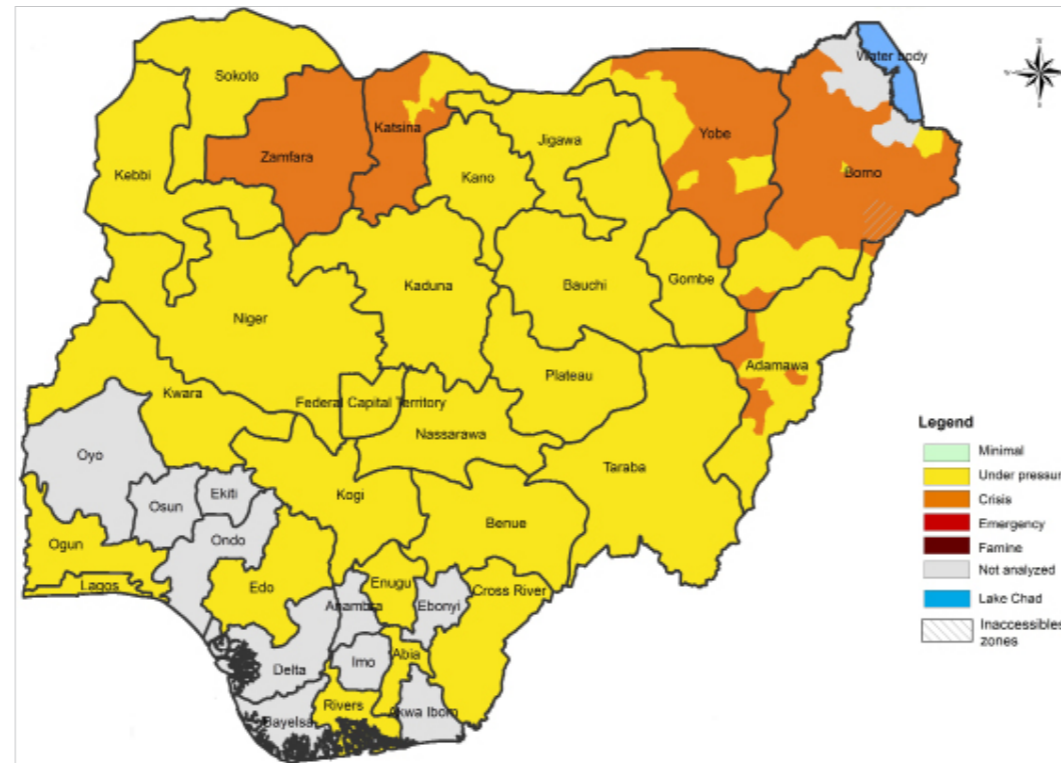

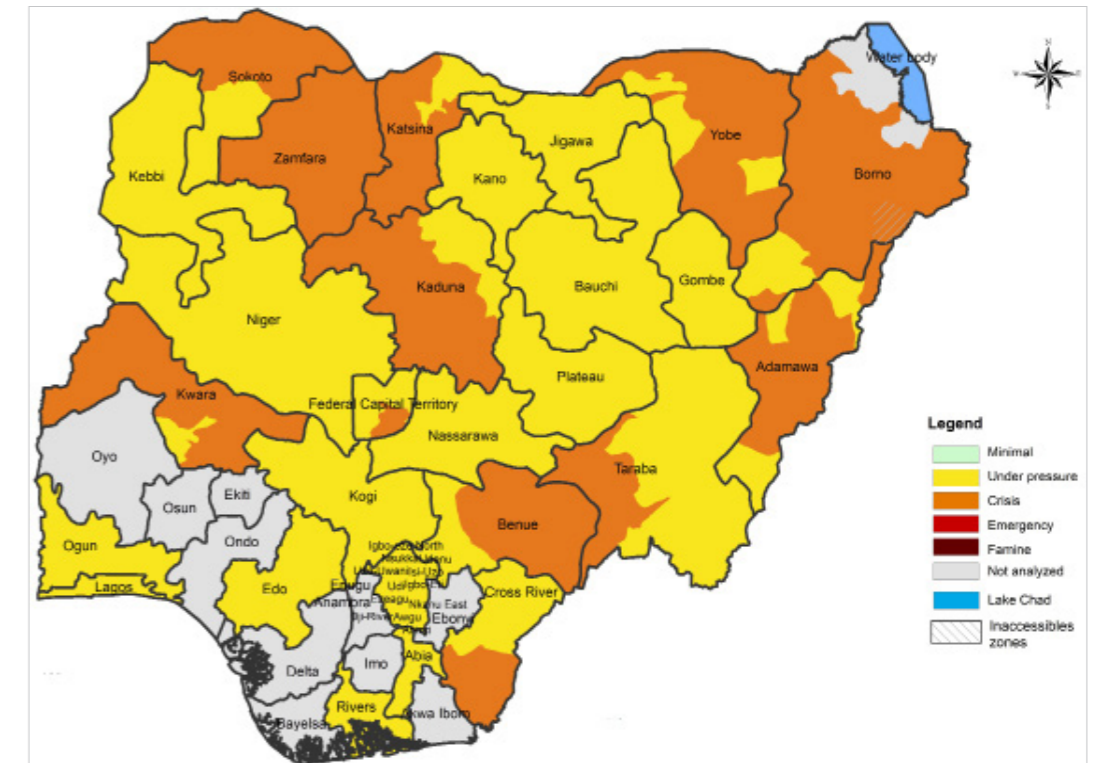

Overview

Despite recent observations of declining food and general commodity prices across Nigeria, an estimated 24.9 million people (including IDPs from Sokoto and Zamfara States) in 26 States and FCT of Nigeria are experiencing Crisis (CH Phase 3) or worse between March and May 2025.

Food Consumption: During the lean season (June to August 2025), households are likely to face increased food consumption deficits. This seasonal challenge is expected to push more populations in risk areas into critical or worse FC conditions across the states. The shift from Stress to Critical FC thresholds is primarily attributed to disrupted livelihoods due mainly to conflicts and climatic shocks. While the households adjust to the recent macroeconomic reforms, they face limited purchasing power and capacity to secure sufficient dietary intake.

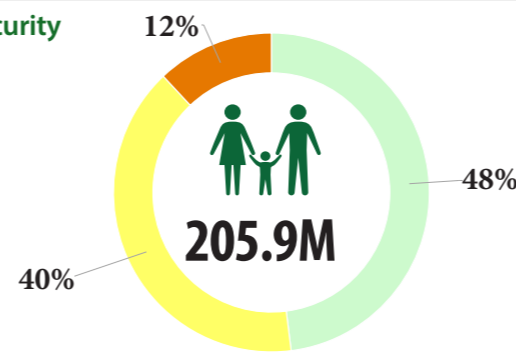
Evolution of Livelihoods: The thresholds for evolution of livelihoods indicator across the states generally ranged from Stress (Phase 2) to Emergency (Phase 4) phases of Food and Nutrition Insecurity (FNI). This may be attributed to the lingering effects of the recent macroeconomic reforms including the removal of fuel subsidies and the floatation of the exchange rate which introduced substantial volatility in the naira exchange rates throughout 2024.

Nutrition: The nutrition situation across the Northwest and Northeast states where information is available ranges from Alert (Phase 2) to Serious (Phase 3), and to Critical (Phase 4) levels. Critical levels of acute malnutrition were found in many LGAs in the northeast, particularly in central Borno, northern Yobe, and part of eastern Sokoto. Specific LGAs in northern Borno (Mobbar, Nganzai), northern Katsina (Mashi), the metropolitan urban and peri-urban areas of Borno State (Maiduguri and Jere) are facing critical.

Current: Acute Food and Nutrition Insecurity March - May 2025



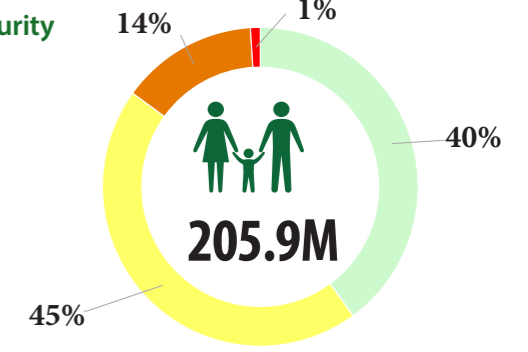
About 24.8 million people including 116 765 IDPs in 26 States and FCT of Nigeria are in Crisis (CH Phase 3) or worse through May 2025.

Conflict and Insecurity

Key Limiting Factors

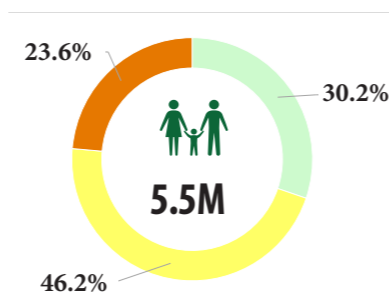
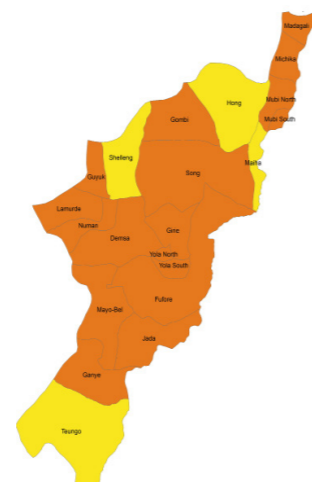
- High prices of foodstuffs limiting households' access to food
- Reduced food stocks at household levels
- Limited income generating activities, loss of jobs and other livelihood activities constrains access to food
- Inadequate food consumption, poor health care-seeking behaviors, poor dietary diversity and lack of minimum acceptable diets results in poor nutrition outcomes
- The limited access to clean water, sanitation and hygiene services exacerbated the prevalence of diseases affecting health and nutrition

About 1.2 million people in Adamawa may likely be in Crisis (CH Phase 3) or worse between June and August 2025.

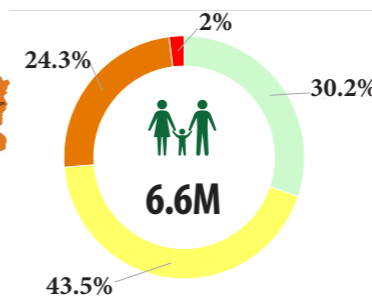
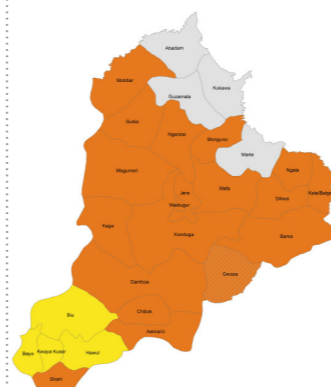


BORNO STATE

About 1.7 million people in Borno may likely be in Crisis (CH Phase 3) or worse between June and August 2025.

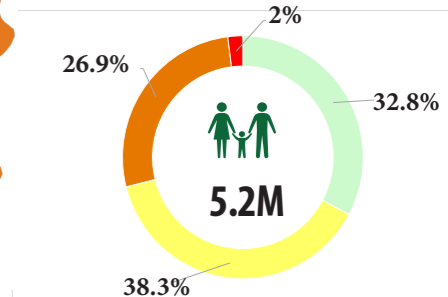
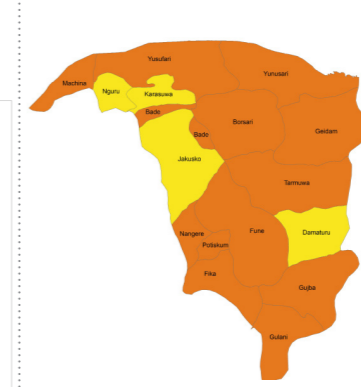


YOBE STATE
